

Office of Institutional Research – Frequently Asked Questions

What is the enrollment of the university?

In Fall 2016, there were 9,658 students enrolled. Of these, 8,734 were undergraduate degree seeking students, 261 were undergraduate non-degree students, and 663 were graduate students. The full-time equivalent enrollment (F.T.E. enrollment) was 8,784. Of our overall students, 57.4 percent are female and 90.5 percent are Pennsylvania residents. For more information... How many minority students are enrolled at Bloomsburg University?

In Fall 2016, underrepresented minority students represented 17.1% of the university population.

How many students live on campus?

In Fall 2016, 3,423 students resided on campus in the dormitories, the upper campus apartments, or Kile Apartments.

How many freshmen enrolled in the fall?

In Fall 2016, there were 1,902 new freshmen enrolled. This includes any freshmen who started during the summer and returned in the fall.

How many faculty & staff are employed at Bloomsburg University?

In Fall 2015, there were 992 full-time employees and 124 part-time employees at Bloomsburg University. Of these, 417 were full-time instructional faculty and 74 were part-time instructional faculty.

What are the graduation rates for Bloomsburg University?

Bloomsburg's average six-year graduation rate is 62%.

How many degrees does Bloomsburg University award in a year?

In 2015-16, there were 1,709 baccalaureate, 260 master's degrees, 1 post-baccalaureate certificate and 12 doctoral degrees awarded.

How many degree programs are available at Bloomsburg University?

Bloomsburg currently offers degrees in 56 undergraduate programs, 18 master's programs, and 2 doctoral programs.
