

Bloomsburg University Office of Institutional Research – Frequently Asked Questions

What is the enrollment of the university?

In Fall 2017, there were 9,287 students enrolled. Of these, 8,303 were undergraduate degree seeking students, 303 were undergraduate non-degree students, and 681 were graduate students. The full-time equivalent enrollment (F.T.E. enrollment) was 8,439. Of our overall students, 57.2 percent are female and 90.7 percent are Pennsylvania residents.

How many minority students are enrolled at Bloomsburg University?

In Fall 2017, underrepresented minority students represented 17.4% of the university population. For undergraduates, 18.1% were underrepresented, and for graduate level students, 8.9% were underrepresented.

How many students live on campus?

In Fall 2017, 3,150 students resided on campus in the dormitories, the upper campus apartments, or Kile Apartments.

How many freshmen enrolled in the fall?

In Fall 2017, there were 1,861 new freshmen enrolled. This includes any freshmen who started during the summer and returned in the fall.

How many faculty & staff are employed at Bloomsburg University?

In Fall 2017, there were 1030 full-time employees and 150 part-time employees at Bloomsburg University. Of these, 419 were full-time instructional faculty and 100 were part-time instructional faculty.

What are the graduation rates for Bloomsburg University?

Bloomsburg's six-year graduation rate for the 2011 first-time, full-time freshmen cohort was 58%. The six-year graduation rate for the 2010 cohort was 62%.

How many degrees does Bloomsburg University award in a year?

In 2016-17, there were 1,838 baccalaureate, 2 post-baccalaureate certificates, 243 master's degrees, and 9 doctoral degrees awarded.

How many degree programs are available at Bloomsburg University?

Bloomsburg currently offers degrees in 57 baccalaureate programs, 18 master's programs, and 2 doctoral programs. We also offer 5 sub-baccalaureate and 4 post-baccalaureate certificates.
